1. THE VINEYARD COMMUNITY CENTRE

The Vineyard Community Centre is a Christian charity whose mission is firstly to serve the local community within Richmond and secondly to see long-lasting change through the transformation of each individual who comes to us. There are broadly four groups of people whom we help.

Firstly, rough sleepers and those in crisis who need short-term support and immediate help through specific services as well as social and spiritual encouragement in addressing the causes of their problems. Our aim is to move people away from crisis to a stable and self-sustaining life style.

Secondly are those who feel lonely, isolated and socially excluded with perhaps learning or mental health problems. Some may be vulnerable adults; other guests will be those moving from homelessness or crisis through to personal recovery. All are welcome at the Vineyard.

Thirdly, we help those who are in crisis and need emergency food supplies. We operate our main Foodbank at the Vineyard Centre and four other satellites provide this service elsewhere across the borough.

Fourthly, those who are moving from crisis as refugees and are in need of a sense of inclusion and self-belief to independence and work.

2. THIS OPPORTUNITY

Our two charity shops have operated very successfully and in the year ending June 2023 achieved £60k sales.

All our goods are given to us by our generous supporters and much of it is high quality ladies clothing and accessories. Besides generating income from the shop, sales go directly towards our work to help those in need. Our aim is that our shops are welcoming places of community and Christian compassion.

In addition to our shop located at the Vineyard Centre in The Vineyard, off Hill Rise, in Richmond we have used additional premises donated by the Richmond Parish Lands Charity in Paradise Road on a short-term rent-free lease. Sadly, this property will only be available for us until the spring, next year and we are currently looking for new premises.

- Achieve weekly sales targets.

- Achieve and maintain high standards of housekeeping, organisation and cleanliness
